UNIVERSAL SKI PASS

Michigan offers a wealth of wonderful ski and ride choices. The Michigan gold Card allows snow sports enthusiasts to slide, ride or stride at more than a dozen of Michigan's finest ski centers. Its use is not restricted by blackout dates. It's great for skiers and skiing families. A portion of the cost is tax deductible. Proceeds from sales support the U.S. National Ski Hall of Fame and Museum. At \$1,000.00 each, the cards afford great opportunities throughout the state. POSSIBLE GIFT CARD FRAUD

Prepaid gift cards have the potential fraud. Gift cards on open display near checkout counters can be a target for crooks. The crook writes down the numbers visible on cards and waits a few days, assuming the cards will be sold. The crook then logs onto the company's web site and tries to make a purchase using the number of the card. If the purchase goes through, the scammer has the merchandise shipped to a safe location where it can't be traced to him/her. The recipient of the gift card discovers that the card is useless. To avoid the problem buy gift cards that do not have numbers in full public display. Use cards with "PIN" numbers on the back, which must be rubbed off. If the PIN number hasn't been rubbed off, a thief cannot steal the card's value. Inspect cards before you buy and be sure that the PIN number on the back has not been tampered. Keep your receipt with the gift card. If you discover that someone has gained its value, return to the store and explain what happened. Some retailers will accept your word and replace the card, although not obligated.

MICHIGAN OFFICE OF SERVICES TO THE AGING
